ANSWERS HEALTH AND RESOURCE FACILITY

Answers Health and Resource Facility is a fully operational non-profit organization that has been ministering to women and families in the Lake Area Region. We currently have two locations; Keystone Heights and Starke. As a Health and Resource Facility, Answers evaluates the needs of those in crisis and provides counsel, health services, education, and a safe place for healing and restoration.

We do these three ways: 1. On-site Services and Programs - Private Consultation with a trained advocate - Free clinical grade pregnancy testing - Free limited OB ultrasound to confirm intrauterine pregnancy and gestational age - Gonorrhea and Chlamydia testing - G.R.O.W. (Generating Real Opportunities for Women) identifies underprivileged women who are trustworthy and motivated and hires them as temporary staff to build the basic skills and work history necessary to secure a meaningful career. - Life Skills Education is a curriculum based on a point system. Each client is assigned to a life mentor, and through completing educational modules on topics such as infant care or budgeting, clients can accumulate points to earn diapers, wipes, gas cards and phone minute cards. 2. Outreach - B.E.A.T. (Becoming Empowered Assertive Teens) Girls Club is held at the local high school and enriches, on average, 50 girls each week, with accurate information and open discussion about sensitive subjects relevant to them, life skills education and mentoring. - When a need is identified in the community, whether for an individual or agency, Answers rallies to meet the need. Examples are: • gathering basic infant care supplies such as cribs, car seats, clothing and diapers for new mothers in need • coordinating a community collection drive to gather personal care items for budget-strained, local food pantries 3. Resource Networking - Answers keeps a comprehensive community resource list, and updates the list every 6 months to ensure we are aware of all that is available in assisting clients in need/crisis without duplicating services - In addition, Answers fosters symbiotic relationships with community businesses, agencies, and programs to ensure timely assistance to clients as well as to offer support to neighboring agencies
